"SODIS"

SODIS - Safe drinking water in 6 hours

Solar water disinfection - the SODIS method - is a simple procedure to disinfect drinking water. Contaminated water is filled in a transparent PET-bottle or glass bottle and exposed to the sun for 6 hours. During this time, the UV-radiation of the sun kills diarrhea generating pathogens. The SODIS-method helps to prevent diarrhea and thereby is saving lives of people. This is urgently necessary as still more than 4000 children die every day from the consequences of diarrhea.

SODIS (abbreviation of Solar Water Disinfection) is an initiative of Ea-wag. We facilitate the dissemination of the SODIS-method in developing countries. Thereby people in the south get access to safe drinking water and can improve their health in the long term.

How does it work?

The SODIS method is very easy to apply: A transparent PET bottle is cleaned with soap. Then, the bottle is filled with water and placed in full sunlight for at least 6 hours. The water has then been disinfected and can be drunk.

Important points to consider when applying the SODIS method Material, color and shape of the bottle.

We recommend using PET bottles in the application of the SODIS method because they are light and do not break. They are also easy to obtain in many regions. However, glass bottles or special bags can also be used. PET bottles are usually labeled as such, but they are not called by the same name in all countries.

The bottles must be transparent and colorless. PET bottles often have a bluish tinge. This is not a problem. Heavily scratched bottles must be replaced.

The bottles must not hold more than 3 liters.

Turbidity

If the water is very turbid, the effectiveness of the method is reduced. It is very easy to determine whether the water is sufficiently clear:

The filled PET bottle must be placed on top of a newspaper headline. Now one must look at the bottom of the bottle from the neck at the top and through the water. If the letters of the headline are readable, the water can be used.

If the letters are not readable, the water must be filtered. This test corresponds to a turbidity of 30 NTU.

Cloudiness

Cloudiness affects the strength of solar radiation and thus also the effectiveness of the method.

Rule of thumb:

- If less than half of the sky is clouded over, 6 hours will be enough to completely disinfect the water
- If more than half of the sky is covered with clouds, the bottle must be placed in the sun for 2 consecutive days.

Rain

The method does not work satisfactorily during lengthy periods of rain. On these days, we recommend collecting rainwater.

Preventing recontamination

The treated water should be kept in the bottle and drunk directly from the bottle, or poured into a cup or glass immediately before it is drunk. In this way, it is possible to prevent the treated water from becoming contaminated again.

What mistakes do new users make most often?

- Using green or brown bottles for the SODIS method; => these bottles absorb UV-A light. This is why only colourless, transparent bottles must be used for the SODIS application.
- The bottles used are too big; => the bottles must not be able to hold more than 3 litres.
- Bottles are placed upright; => the bottles must be laid horizontally in the sun. This increases the area exposed to the sunlight and reduces the depth of the water the light must penetrate. (With turbidity of 26 NTU, only half of the UV-A radiation penetrates farther than 10cm)
- After the SODIS method has been applied, the treated water is poured into dirty containers, so the water is immediately contaminated again; => The treated water should be kept in the bottle and drunk directly from the bottle, or poured into a cup or glass immediately before it is drunk.

What water can I use for the SODIS method?

The SODIS method needs relatively clear water. You can find out with a simple test whether the water is too turbid. The source of the water (well, surface water) does not matter. Water that has been polluted with chemicals (poisons, fertilisers, etc.) must not be used. The SODIS method only kills germs. The chemical composition of the water remains unchanged.

Where should I place the bottles?

Lay the bottles on a clean surface in the sun, where no shadows will fall for the whole treatment time.

If possible, lay the bottles on a reflective surface, like a sheet of corrugated iron, and protect it from cooling by the wind. The reflection and higher temperature will speed up the disinfection process. However, this is not essential for the application. The bottles can be set down on any surface (wood, concrete, clay brick, etc.).

How long can I store the water that I have treated with the SODIS method?

If the bottle is kept unopened after treatment and stored in a cool, dark place, it can be stored for as long as you wish. The dead bacteria cannot multiply again. The only things that may grow are algae. However, these do not represent a health hazard.

How long can I use the same PET bottle for?

UV-A radiation must penetrate the bottle in order to kill the germs. Clear, unused bottles normally allow more than 60% of the UV-A light over 340 nm to pass through. Experiments have shown that older, used bottles allow less UV-A light to pass through them.

Besides the ageing process of the bottle material, scratches on its surface will also mean that it allows less UV-A light through. So it is very important to handle the bottles carefully. We recommend replacing old bottles and bottles that are no longer transparent after about 6 to 12 months of daily use.

How can I tell the difference between a PET bottle and a PVC bottle?

Only PET bottles should be used for the SODIS method because PVC can be harmful to your health. PET and PVC bottles are normally marked accordingly. The labels can vary from country to country, though. If the bottles are not marked, you can only tell the difference between the bottles by

setting fire to them.

PET burns quickly and easily when it is held in a flame. When it is taken out of the flame, the fire goes out slowly, or it may keep burning. The smoke smells sweet.

PVC does not burn easily. The material does not burn at all when not in the flame. PVC smoke smells acrid.

I wondered later on if this was some how my brain's way of predicting the *United 93* crash.

My brother's friend was staying with us. He wanted me to take him to pawn shops to pawn off his things for money, one was a camera that was at another friend's house. "National Preparedness Month"

Since 9/11, the Government and organizations like the American Red Cross wanted to get Americans more prepared for disasters may it be natural or man made. They made September National Preparedness Month. You may even use Captain Trowbridge's SODIS Method (see the article above) for more water. You may need to survive on your own after an emergency. This means having your own food, water, and other supplies in sufficient quantity to last for at least three days. Local officials and relief workers will be on the scene after a disaster, but they cannot reach everyone immediately. You could get help in hours, or it might take days. In addition, basic services such as electricity, gas, water, sewage treatment, and telephones may be cut off for days, or even a week or longer.

Recommended Items to Include in a Basic Emergency Supply Kit:

- Water, one gallon of water per person per day for at least three days, for drinking and sanitation
- Food, at least a three-day supply of non-perishable food
- Battery-powered or hand crank radio and a NOAA Weather Radio with tone alert and extra batteries for both
- Flashlight and extra batteries
- First aid kit
- Whistle to signal for help
- Dust mask, to help filter contaminated air and plastic sheeting and duct tape to shelterin-place
- Moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties for personal sanitation
- Wrench or pliers to turn off utilities
- Can opener for food (if kit contains canned food)
- Local maps
- Cell phone with chargers, inverter or solar charger

Additional Items to Consider Adding to an Emergency Supply Kit:

- Prescription medications and glasses
- Infant formula and diapers
- Pet food and extra water for your pet
- Cash or traveler's checks and change
- Important family documents such as copies of insurance policies, identification and bank account records in a waterproof, portable container. You can use the Emergency Financial First Aid Kit (EFFAK) PDF, 277Kb) developed by Operation Hope, FEMA and Citizen Corps to help you organize your information.
- Emergency reference material such as a first aid book or information from http://www.ready.gov.
- Sleeping bag or warm blanket for each person. Consider additional bedding if you live in a cold-weather climate.
- Complete change of clothing including a long sleeved shirt, long pants and sturdy shoes. Consider additional clothing if you live in a cold-weather climate.
- Household chlorine bleach and medicine dropper When diluted nine parts water to one part bleach, bleach can be used as a disinfectant. Or in an emergency, you can use it to treat water by using 16 drops of regular household liquid bleach per gallon of water. Do not use scented, color safe or bleaches with added cleaners.

- Fire Extinguisher
- Matches in a waterproof container
- Feminine supplies and personal hygiene items
- Mess kits, paper cups, plates and plastic utensils, paper towels
- Paper and pencil
- Books, games, puzzles or other activities for children

Find out how to keep food safe during and after an emergency by visiting http://www.foodsafety.gov.

Also, not noted above, you can get MRE's (Meals Ready to Eat) from places like "Smith & Edwards" up near Willard Bay and (http://www.thereadystore.com). They include their own food heater activated when you add water. So just add water, wait for it to heat and eat. They also have a 5 - 20 year shelf life that makes them perfect for being emergency food that you can keep stored for years if needed.
