

McGregor Talks of 'Star Wars' Woes

LONDON (AP) Ewan McGregor says playing young Obi-Wan Kenobi in `Star Wars' movie wasn't all swords and special effects. Some of the filming was ``the epitome of tedium,'' the 28-year-old Scottish actor said in Tuesday's Express.

``The work was so complex with all the special effects and stuff that I found myself hanging around for days, '' he said. ``I was frowning a lot. It became just a frowning exercise.''

The George Lucas-directed movie, ``Star Wars: Episode I Phantom Menace, '' is the first installment in the much-anticipated three-part prequel to the blockbuster space trilogy. It comes out next month.

Boredom didn't stop McGregor from signing up for the two other

``Star Wars'' movies, which are to be completed by 2005.
``I guess I'm just an actor who can't say no. Besides, there's nothing cooler than being a Jedi knight, '' he said.



WHO'S OUT THERE? Excerpts from Discover Magazine, April 1999 by Jeff Greenwald

The search for intelligent life in outer space is going so well, scientists need a little help from you and your computer. For nearly 40 years researchers like Dan Werthiemer have been scanning the cosmos with high powered instruments in hopes of stumbling upon an alien broadcast. The search has been slow and laborious. What is really frustrating is the fact that there are not enough supercomputers to sort through the mountains of radio-transmission data they are collecting. Now, thanks to Werthiemer, anyone with a personal computer can join the search for exterterresterial intelligence. It's called SETI@home: a datasorting software program that masquerades as a screen-saver. Late this month, the software downloaded off the Internet (http://setiathome.ssl.berkeley.edu) will allow ameteur computer jockeys to receive and collate chunks of data from the world's largest radio telescope-- the thousand-foot-diameter dish in the hills south of Arecibo, Puerto Rico. SETI@home users don't need to know a thing about astronomy. Nor do they need to know how to look for signals. The program does all the work whenever the screen saver is on. With it's powerful but narrow beam, the Arecibo radio telescope views just a millionth of the sky at once. After six months, though, this beam manages to scan the entire sky in its field (about one-third of the total sky). So the piggyback strategy is almost as good as having the telescope to yourself. The program today scans 168 million channels. The bottleneck in this process is the processing power of the program's mainframes. They can't analyze the information as fast as it's pouring in. Fortunately, the SETI@home screen saver offers an ingenious solution. Users can receive 256-Kilobyte data chunks- about 100 seconds of viewing, fresh from the Arecibo Observatory. With casual use on a typical home computer, the screen saver will take a week or two to crunch the numbers. At that point, users are cued to send the finished chunk in and download another. Users can watch the analysis unfold in real time- and be the first ones on the block to detect signals from a distant world. A hundred users tested the program last November. In February some 210,000 SETI@home volunteers were waiting to download the software- already the world's largest computer task force. The opportunities for the ameteur SETI researcher have never been better. Now, with the advent of SETI@home, it's even possible that the first proof of extraterrestrial intelligence may begin as a spike on someone's screen saver.

Viacom, the Star Trek parent company, has announced that consideration is underway for the possible launch of a cable network which will compete against the Sci-Fi Channel. "Our sci-fi channel will consist of real, true sci-fi, not horror," said Viacom chairman Sumner Redstone, referring to the Sci-Fi Channel's airing of fantasy and horror content, along with science fiction. While exclusive rerun rights for classic "Star Trek" have been sold to the Sci-Fi Channel, rights for the three 24th-century spinoff series remain in Viacom's hands, and may be used to help fill out such a channel's programming. Viacom used to own half of USA Networks, the Sci-Fi Channel parent company, but that interest was sold 18 months ago. A non-compete clause prevents Viacom from launching such a network until 2001. Viacom spokesman Carl Folta noted that there were no definite plans to create such a network, and that it is merely a point of discussion.

UltimateTV is reporting that William Shatner (TOS: Kirk) will appear in this year's season finale of NBC's "3rd Rock from the Sun," playing "The Big Giant Head," the oft-mentioned supreme commander that the show's stars report to. The hour long episode, which will air on May 25, will have Shatner's character visit Earth to check up on the show's star aliens. "All the writers thought Shatner was going to be this imperious, difficult, larger-than-life guy," said show producer Bill Martin. "But he came in as this nice guy with eyes wide open who was willing to make an absolute ass of himself. He was terrific. We were all staggered ... [and] we're all slobbering tohave him back."

Voyager's "Think Tank," guest starring Jason Alexander, gave Voyager its best overnight ratings since the "Dark Frontier" two-part episode, with a 5.3 rating, 8 share. The episode finished 4th in its timeslot, after the three big networks and head of the WB and Fox (both of which aired repeats).

"Star Trek: Insurrection" recently passed the \$70 million mark in the US. It is now out of the top 50 movies at the US box office. It is also starting to appear on certain airlines' in-flight movies.

Mania is reporting that the 1999 Hallmark Star Trek Christmas ornament will be the Deep Space Nine Runabout Rio Grande, featuring the recorded voice of Michael Dorn as Worf.

TRANSWARP DRIVE:

TREKKIES: THE PEOPLE AND THE FILM by Gabriel C. Koerner

Trekkies. Or, Trekkers. Take your pick. For decades, they've been poked fun at, stereotyped, and endured countless other derogatory barbs inflicted upon them by the mundane, faceless members of the supposed "in-crowd." I am Gabriel C. Koerner, one of the "stars," if you will, of "Trekkies." I'm sixteen years of age, and an aspiring filmmaker. In this article, I will discuss Star Trek fandom in general, and the film which so beautifully represents it.

Trekkies have been the focal point of ridicule for the news media as well. It seems as though enjoying an optimistic and intelligent program such as Star Trek also means sacrificing your "cool" or ability to be taken seriously. It has been this way for a very longtime.

But it is not too late to undo some of the damage that has been done. "Trekkies," a documentary film which I feel very privileged to be a part of, is the first step in the rectification of the negative label attached to being a fan of the thirty-one year phenomenon.

The first utter misconception that the film endeavors to repair is the one that all fans are misguided saps who wear their uniforms and pointy ears everywhere, have no lives, couldn't get a date to save humanity, etc. In fact, when weighed against the majority, very few of these actually exist, perhaps 1 in 50 fans. The only reason the nutballs are considered the stereotype fan is that they're the ones who are the most prominent. They're the ones who stick out like a sore thumb amongst the public eye. It has nothing to do with quantity.

What makes Star Trek fans unique, contrary to how the public and media view them, is their diversity. You see, there is no one single paradigm Trekkie that we can look at and say, "This is the definitive model for a Star Trek fan," as so many have done. Star Trek fans come in all different sizes, shapes, colors, ethnic backgrounds, families, creeds, incomes, and, most importantly, levels of devotion. This ranges from people who simply enjoy the show to a fan who has devoted his/her life to it. Paraphrased, there is no such thing as a stereotype Trekkie. Look at the many fans portrayed in "Trekkies," and you'll see that is the case.

The second major misconception fixed by "Trekkies" is that Star Trek fans are so different from the average person that they are almost a sub species. This is not at all the case. The activities of congregated Star Trek fans are perceived as being "weird" or "out there" by the public. These activities, such as wearing costumes and make-up to Star Trek conventions or Trek club functions, are in fact comparable to the activities of sports fans who wear uniforms to games, or people who go to rock concerts looking like KISS gone horribly wrong. The difference is that when Trek fans do it, it is frowned upon or laughed at. But when the followers of the latter two do it, it is dismissed as a normal activity. The fact of the matter is, basically all types of fandom consist of the same types of people, the same varying degrees of devotion, and the same activities. There is absolutely no reason that Star Trek fans should be singled out, just because their aesthetic varies slightly from other types of fandom

Another interesting comparison to which the film at times subtly hints is the comparison between Star Trek fandom and religion. As I ponder it, I realize that there are incredible connections. Star Trek fans devote themselves to their show because they have faith that in the end their support of the program will lead to the establishment of the Trektopian Future.

Likewise, people of any religious denomination devote themselves to their religion because they have faith that in the end their worship and faith will manifest itself in the form of eternal life. Both rely on faith alone, with little to no empirical indications or evidence influencing them. This is not to discourage the hopes and dreams of either, certainly not religion. The fact of the matter is that many billions of people need some structured ideology to hold them together. Many choose religion. Some choose Star Trek.

"Trekkies" is hosted by my friend (thanks to the opportunity I had to meet her due to the documentary) and Star Trek star Denise Crosby. Denise gets the ball rolling, and then steps back to let the wildly entertaining footage speak for itself. The main stars of the film, in addition to Denise, are former Whitewater juror Barbara Adams, the Bourguignons (dentists with a Trek-themed office), myself, and many others. The film also features insightful interviews with cast members of all incarnations of Star Trek. It is the first genuine look into the life-blood of the Star Trek franchise, and it is a completely satisfying one.

It must be understood, though, that the documentary represents a look at the extreme levels of Trek fandom. At first, this was a subject of controversy in my mind. Why not show the world the balanced fans? Well, because a film consisting of normally dressed people who say, "I have Star Trek balanced with the rest of my life and I generally keep my appreciation of Star Trek repressed in my daily activities," would really have little to no entertainment value. "Trekkies" delivers a massively entertaining wallop of humor, but not without its heart-warming moments. It strikes a perfect balance between the two, and while at times it skates on thin ice, very few fans should be offended by its portrayal of Star Trek fandom.

In a way, quite a bit rested on my shoulders in my role in the film. Most likely, I was brought into the project to be the representation of both the adolescent and less obsessive denominations of fans, as well as being exactly at the right place at exactly the right time, when Bob Justman just happened to fondly remember me before a huge audience at just the right moment when Denise just happened to be shooting. The odds were millions and millions to one, but I beat them. I just wish that some of the many other talented teenagers such as myself had been given the same opportunities.

The film has helped me a great deal personally. As a result of my involvement

with it, I have met and befriended several prominent people in the entertainment industry, as well as being presented with many rare opportunities. I learned more about myself and who I am in my quarter hour on-screen than I ever did from looking in the mirror or listening to myself.

So, will I be remembered all my life as "that kid from 'Trekkies'"? Perhaps, but, as Jonathan Frakes once put it, "It is better to be typecast than not cast at all." But who cares. Go see "Trekkies" when it comes out. You won't regret it.
